DEVELOPMENT UPDATE AND CLARIFICATION

Resurfacing Courts 1 to 4

Courts 1 to 4 have a provisional date set of 31st August 2017 for resurfacing to be completed.

New Lights on Courts 1 to 5

In conjunction with the resurfacing of courts 1 to 4, it will be necessary to upgrade the court lighting. Technical details are currently being formulated in this regard.

Digging Down on Court 1 to 4

No decision has yet been made. No decision will be made without the member's consent. We anticipate the costs and benefits being put to the members in June 2017 so the members can make an informed determination. It is obvious to us that unless the additional costs of digging down are relatively small and the benefits significant, such an option could not be justified. That said, we have not discounted the idea out of hand as such a development would offer the following benefits

Digging down courts 1 to 4 to the same level as court 5 and having all five courts on the same level would have 1 primary and 1 secondary benefit

- 1. It would add significant additional spacing between each court from 1-5.
- 2. The existing court 5 viewing arrangement would be replicated behind courts 1 to 4.
